Maintenance

Water Awareness and Summer Safety

No matter where you live, summer and water seem to go together. Here are a few items to keep in mind this season:

With mosquitoes on everyone's mind, eliminate standing water areas, such as bird baths, kid's toys, pails, wading pools, plant saucers or other places where water may accumulate. A child can drown in just a few inches of water in a bucket – adult supervision is essential when kids are around water.

It's also prime time for open windows. Keep in mind that window screens keep bugs outside – they don't keep kids inside. Ensure children are supervised when windows are open and keep furniture which could be climbed away from windows. It's tempting to use the dresser drawers as steps, for example, so be mindful that kids may use furniture in unexpected ways. Check that any blind cords hang freely – they shouldn't be knotted or tied to prevent strangulation. If you have concerns, please contact maintenance.

- **Juneteenth. June 19**th- It is the oldest known celebration commemorating the ending of slavery in the United States. This was two and a half years after President Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation which had become official January 1, 1863.
