The Continental Congress approved the final wording of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776, after working for a couple of days on the draft submitted on July 2nd and finally agreeing on all of the edits and changes.

July 4, 1776, became the date included on the Declaration of Independence and the beautiful handwritten copy that was signed in August, 1776 - now displayed at the National Archives in Washington D.C.
