• **Disconnect Garden Hoses** - Disconnect your Garden Hose from the Outside Hose Bib and store until Spring

• *Never Turn Off Heat* - Set your thermostat no lower than 65 degrees. Event if you are leaving your home for more than 24 Hours, it is imperative to leave the heat running to help prevent your pipes from freezing and bursting.

Let Your Faucets Drip - Open your faucets in the kitchen & bathrooms to allow the cold water to drip

Open Cabinet Doors Where Plumbing is Located -

Open your kitchen & bathroom cabinet doors to allow warm air to circulate around the plumbing

Keep Your Garage Closed -

Keep your garage door completely close when not in use during winter months
